## Part one



INTERVIEWER: Good afternoon, I'm Greg Dawson, reporting live from CBN studios in New York for our weekly program, *My greatest challenge*. Today, I have with me Lindsey. Good afternoon, Lindsey...

Interviewer: Wow! You've been all over the map! Now, Lindsey, could you tell us about the people you met on your trip into the heart of America. Did you have any difficulties? Lindsey: Well, I must say that during those six months I was scared more than once and it was exhausting... I walked more than 1,500 miles... I sometimes slept out in the open... I spent time with complete strangers... But all in all I reckon I managed to adjust to different... cultures and ways of life... I stayed with all sorts of people. I even met a South African family in a remote village in Indiana... and that was just... great!

Interviewer: I guess it must have been hard for you to find the strength to keep going.
